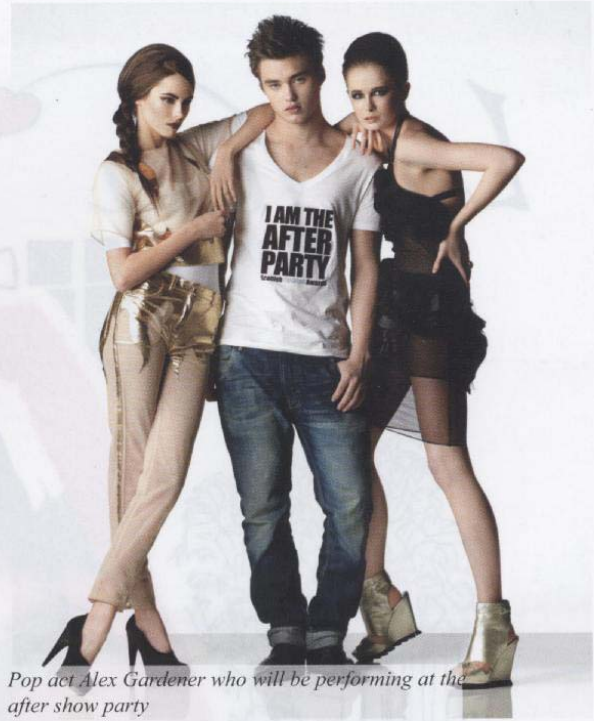

Nude or red lips?

Both, I have two looks – I love Bobbi Brown's Baby Peach for a nude look – it's a metallic lip colour and has a wonderful shimmer to it. It's creamy and feels lovely and soft. For a more dramatic night-time look I love a deep red. Bobbi Brown's Red (10) – I wear it alone with no liner for a rich full coverage, topped with a hint of Crystal lip gloss also by Bobbi Brown.

My preferred colour-cosmetics

I love Lancome's Pink Punk and Black Palette eyeshadow compact. I love dark eyes with a hint of colour. I also couldn't live without the Lancome Artline – the best liquid eyeliner on the market.

Must-have foundation

I've just discovered a new foundation, Bobbi Brown Natural Finish long lasting foundation. It's a great oil free formula and very natural – I hate a really heavy look. Although it can be built up if you want a deeper look, maybe for a big night out you can do that also. It has a SPF 15, which is crucial!

Favourite skincare?

I love Chanel's Hydramax range for everyday skincare. Their Hydramax + active serum is a joy to the skin.

My secret beauty weapon

Never put your face in the sun – I haven't put my face in the sun since I was about 19-years-old. When on holiday I wear what I call a factor 'duffle coat' – about SPF 50 – total block. Most recent beauty discovery
